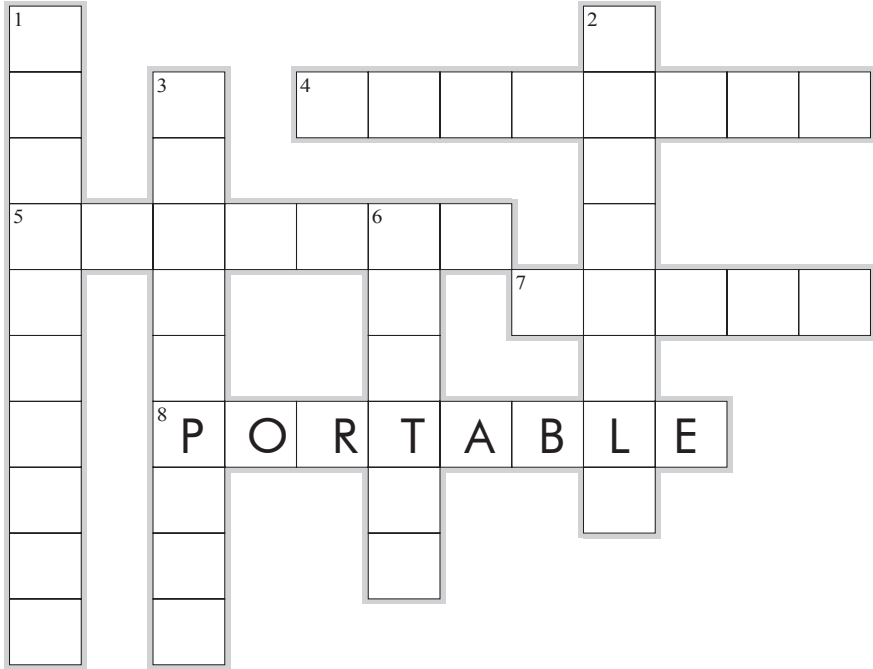


Derivatives Crossword

navigo	3rd person singular
spectatis	3rd person plural
laudat	1st person plural
portamus	2nd person singular
amas	1st person singular
orant	2nd person plural

For the Parse Strings game, you will need to know the names of the grammatical features of verbs, such as person and number. Here is the table for the present tense, using the verb amo.

	<u>singular</u>	<u>plural</u>
1st person:	amo	amamus
2nd person:	amas	amatis
3rd person:	amat	amant

You can see that amamus is 1st person plural, and amat is 3rd person singular. Try to figure out the rest of the answers. You may need to refer back to this table for future Parse Strings.
